

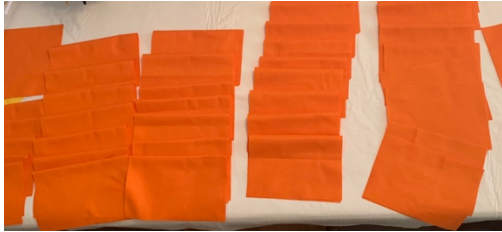
DIRECTIONS FOR SIMPLE MASKS FOR CHILDREN (WITHOUT FILTER POCKET)

1. Cut 7 inch wide strips for smaller child masks (ages 3-5) and/or 8 inch wide strips for larger child masks (ages 6-9). Then, cut those strips into 5 inch wide pieces or 10 inch wide pieces to fold over. You will need 2 of these “fronts” per mask.
2. Sew right sides together with $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam all around, but leave an opening (around 2-3 inches) to flip project outside-out. Backstitch when you start and end here.
3. Cut all 4 corners at an angle to lessen bulk.
4. Flip the mask outside-out. Use corner tool (if you have one) to straighten and push out corners.
5. Iron the project flat, making sure to fold in the seam of the open area.
6. Sew the opening closed. Sew about $\frac{1}{8}$ ” from edge.
7. Create a casing by sewing $\frac{1}{2}$ ” from the side edges. Backstitch at both ends.
8. Cut $\frac{3}{4}$ ”-1” wide t-shirt yarn into 40-43” long pieces. Thread through from the bottom of the mask and around the top and back down again. The top loop will go above and the tie will be at the base of the hairline.
9. All done. 😊

Sew right sides together with $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam all around, but leave an opening (around 2-3 inches) to flip project outside-out. Backstitch when you start and end here.



Cut all 4 corners at an angle to lessen bulk.



Flip the mask outside-out. Use corner tool (if you have one) to straighten and push out corners. Iron the project flat, making sure to fold in the seam of the open area.

Sew the opening closed. Sew about $\frac{1}{8}$ ” from edge.



Create a casing by sewing 1/2" from the side edges. Backstitch at both ends.



Cut 3/4"-1" wide t-shirt yarn into 40-43" long pieces. Thread through from the bottom of the mask and around the top and back down again. The top loop will go above and the tie will be at the base of the hairline.
